

HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT 56 OF 1974

REGULATIONS RELATING TO NAMES THAT MAY NOT BE USED IN RELATION TO THE PROFESSION OF EMERGENCY CARE

Published under Government Notice R701 in *Government Gazette* 35636 of 29 August 2012.

The Minister of Health had, under [section 61](#)(1)(d) read with [section 40](#) of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974), and after consultation with the Health Professions Council of South Africa, made the regulations in the schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. Definitions

In this schedule, “**the Act**” means the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974) and any expression or word to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall have that meaning, unless the context otherwise indicates.

2. Names that may not be used

No person, who is not registered in terms of the Act as:-

- (a) Basic Life Support Provider;
- (b) Intermediate Life Support Provider; or
- (c) Advanced Life Support Provider in any of the following categories of advanced life support:-
 - i. Paramedic;
 - ii. Emergency Care Technician; and
 - iii. Emergency Care Practitioner,

may use that particular appellation or title or any derivatives thereof.

3. Repeal

The regulations published in Government Notice No. 1213 of 22 October 2004 are hereby repealed.
